May 2021 School Update

As we all look forward to opportunities that the relaxing of our Coronavirus restrictions will bring, I thought it an ideal time to update you on some staffing changes and some plans for the upcoming weeks today. It goes without saying however that we will continue to follow the most up to date risk assessments and procedures required to continue to keep us all safe. We will continue to work in our two bubbles and where possible, keep staffing arrangements the same. We are now able if required, to allow some staff members to cross bubbles however we will endeavour to keep this to a minimum.

Staffing

For those of you with children in Derwent and Foss Class, I have no doubt that the children will have mentioned our student teacher Miss Oscroft to you. Miss Oscroft has proved herself to be an outstanding student teacher and I am absolutely delighted to inform you that following from our recruitment process, we have appointed Miss Oscroft to be our new Key Stage 1 teacher from this September. The position has become available as Mrs Cummings will be working at Langton on a part-time basis, two days a week from September. Miss Oscroft will therefore become the teacher of Foss Class in September and we all very much look forward to having her as part of our Langton family. Mrs Cummings as I write, is currently babysitting the hatching chicks and I am grateful that we will still have Mrs Cummings' excellent ideas, although on a reduced timetable.

We will be saying a fond farewell to Mrs Tetlow at the end of this academic year. Mrs Tetlow has been linked to Langton School for around 24 years and has been on the staff for fifteen. Her commitment to the school and expertise, especially with our youngest children, is second to none and we will miss her greatly. Thankfully she doesn't live too far away so we are hoping that Mrs Tetlow will pop in every so often to say hello. We are currently carrying out recruitment to fill this position.

Whilst our pupil numbers have gone from strength to strength over the past few years, at Langton we are committed to keeping teaching groups as small as possible. In order to ensure that this happens in Key Stage 2 next year, I am also excited to let you know that Mrs Huntriss is going to be increasing her teaching responsibility and will be working as a Key Stage 2 teacher full time from September. Mr Walker, Miss Boyle and Mrs Huntriss will form the Key Stage 2 teaching team and will be teaching more flexibly between Rye and Ouse classes. As we prepare the children for secondary school, having access to more than one teacher will no doubt benefit them and we can maximise the expertise of our teachers. For example, Mrs Huntriss will continue to teach Science in Key Stage 2, which I know is a very popular subject at Langton!
